Father Nigel Woollen, who is a curate at Knock Shrine, has recently written a book about Knock which is called *“The Lamb will Conquer”* (Veritas, 2017).

In one of his reflections, Father Nigel speaks about Pentecost as follows: *“The Spirit has already been given and now he must fill his friends in a completely new way, in order to send them out to the ends of the earth, to bring everyone to know the good news of this new life. After his resurrection, Jesus has ascended to the Father: once more he returns to the Father’s house, now glorified and raised to new life by the power of the Spirit.”*

Father Nigel goes on to explain that Jesus did not leave a guidebook or blueprint on how to start the Church but, instead, he sent us the Holy Spirit to do that work instead. He adds; *“When we pray not knowing what God is up to, we have to hang on in there praying and waiting. Then God can do what he wills. And his will is always good.”*

I can recall prayers associated with the Holy Spirit from childhood such as: *“Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your people and enkindle in us the fire of your love”* or the hymn which includes the words *“Spirit of the living God, flow afresh on us.”*

At this time of the year, let us remember the children who have recently made their Confirmation in our prayers. This is a very important occasion in their lives and we pray that Holy Spirit will inspire, encourage and protect them in the years ahead.

Pentecost

20th May 2018

Some of you may have visited Manresa, the Jesuit Retreat Centre in Clontarf. In the prayer room, there are some beautiful stained glass windows by the renowned artist, Evie Hone. One of them is entitled “Pentecost”. The Manresa website explains that: *“The window shows the arrival of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the Apostles. The lower section depicts the ministry of the Apostles after Pentecost as they attended to the care and healing of the sick.”*

The fact that Our Lady is depicted right in the centre of the apostles with her hands raised in prayer as the Holy Spirit descends on them is really significant. The mother of Jesus remained with the apostles after the Crucifixion, the Resurrection and the Ascension. Now, she is also present at Pentecost.

We are told in Acts 1:14, that that the disciples are in the Upper Room *“in continuous prayer,*

together with several women, including Mary the mother of Jesus.” It can be said that, through her prayers and patience, Mary encouraged the Apostles to prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit. This time has been described as an experience like a retreat as the apostles prayed and reflected on their future mission in the Church.

It’s also a good time for us to reflect on our own mission and ministry as we all have one. It may be a ministry of prayer, a ministry of welcome, a ministry of assisting others, a ministry of service to the poor, a ministry of music or a ministry on the altar assisting with the liturgy.

Just as the apostles did not know what the call of Jesus would mean in their lives, so it is for us as Jesus’s plans for us may only become gradually clearer over time. As Blessed John Henry
