There is something very touching about Jesus engaging Moses and Elijah. It's as if these two major historic figures from the Hebrew scriptures are giving Jesus strength and advice for his difficult journey to come. An encounter with God in prayer, can give us strength and support as well but how often do we allow time for this in our busy lives? Jesus is encouraging us today to take time out for prayer and reflection this Lent.

Pope Benedict once spoke in Lourdes about the "thin veil" that separates this world from the next. This veil is pulled back completely during this heavenly encounter. And we hear the great invitation from God the Father to each and every one of us: *"This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!"* These powerful words resonate down through history to us all today.

This story reminds us of the times in our lives when we have felt particularly close to God. It may have been during a retreat or when walking in the countryside. Or perhaps a time when someone we love said something special to us. We can always treasure this memory and recall it in times of difficulty. I can remember an old neighbour that I met on our road who said that there is "always hope." He was a man of faith who lived well into his nineties and I often think of him when there are a few challenges around.

Let us pray in the coming week that we may recognise these moments of grace in our lives when God is giving us encouragement and refreshment, and to have the time and space to recall them during busier times in our lives when the pace of life may be a lot faster. Because God is always present in our lives even when we are unable to recognise it.

mountain." You can't really expect to get better verification than that! The last line here has a tremendous power of authenticity and witness about it. St Peter, who later became the first Pope, says *"We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain."*

The familiar Gospel story of the Transfiguration is a beautiful, moving encounter with the things of heaven. It's a dramatic moment when Jesus encounters Moses and Elijah and the voice of God the Father is heard.



Jesus brings his inner circle comprising Peter, James and John with him to Mount Tabor for this remarkable event. The transfiguration is recounted in the gospels of Matthew 17:1-9 and Mark 9:2-8 as well as Luke 9:28-36. In addition, 2 Peter 1:16-18 also refers to it, where it says:

"For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy

It was an event which clearly remained fresh in St Peter's mind and one that he no doubt often recalled, especially in times of difficulty. He was literally an eye witness to Christ's glory. Father Kieran O'Mahony says the following about this Gospel: *"There is a sense in which life is always "on the move" and we cannot freeze even special moments.
