In other words, they wish to be introduced into his own particular relationship with God. We cannot fail to be struck by two things: first, its utter simplicity – it is almost a child's prayer."

A Carmelite priest once told me that "We [should] turn to God who is our help both now and always." Saint Oscar Romero once said "No prayer fully expresses our faith." But what should we be seeking in prayer? Our lives are a journey to find God. Sometimes it is difficult to acknowledge God's presence in the midst of our busy lives and, on other occasions, we can feel loved by God. We can sometimes pray to be enlightened so that we can recognise God's presence in our lives, even if we can only realise it in retrospect.

Throughout the Gospels, there are many examples of Jesus at prayer most notably in the Garden of Gethsemane. He also encouraged his disciples to go to a lonely place to pray and, when they asked him how to pray, Jesus gave us the Our Father. The Our Father focuses, in the first instance, on God and then on our own needs. We acknowledge who God is and, in the second part, who we are before God. It is a prayer that shows us what is at the heart of all prayer. Brother John of Taize says of the Our Father: "They want to learn Jesus's prayer.

The scripture scholar Father Martin Hogan says: "prayer is not about informing God about something God is not aware of. There is no need for many words, he says, because your Father knows what you need before you ask him."

St Cyprian (c. 200 - 258), the Third century Saint, said of the Our Father: "We do not say 'My Father, who art in heaven,' nor 'Give me this day my daily bread'; nor does each one ask that only his or her own debt should be forgiven.... Our prayer is public and common; and when we pray we pray not for one but for the whole people, because we the whole people are one."

The spirit of the Lord's Prayer has shaped Christian consciousness from the beginning. Cyril of Jerusalem (c. 315 AD - 386), instructed those about to be baptised: "If you

HOW TO HAVE A MASS OFFERED IN HOLY CHILD PARISH: Recently there have been a number of serious mistakes made in relation to offering Masses for named intentions in the Parish. This proved very embarrassing for the families involved as well as for the Priests and Staff for which I can only offer my sincere apology. As a result of these mistakes we're changing the way Mass Intentions are booked. As of now all Masses should be booked through the Parish Office where the Mass Intentions Diary is now kept. This can be done either directly by going in person to or ringing the Reception Desk during Office hours. I know this won't suit everybody so very shortly a new envelope will be available in the churches which you can fill in with all the details of the Mass you want offered and leave it well in advance of the date in one of the church safes or at the Reception Desk on Sunday mornings. Because of the demand for Mass Intentions, particularly at the weekend, we accept multiple intentions for each Mass. The 11.15am Sunday Mass is now also open for Intentions. Please note that Masses can no longer be booked in the Sacristy. Many thanks for your patience as we try to put a more reliable Mass booking system in place.
