

baptism which is in the name of the three divine persons following Jesus's command to "go make disciples of all nations, baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

So our baptismal calling is also a call to action. It's not good enough to be baptised and go away thinking that our job is done. Being baptised is the beginning of what can often become a challenging but rewarding journey. Blessed John Henry Newman said "God has created me for some definite service that he has not given to another." It is of course up to us whether or not we choose to accept the call.

In every parish, we are also called to be a welcoming, outward looking community of faith. As Pope Francis puts it so well "the church is not a museum of saints, but a hospital for sinners". He later expanded on this point: "I see the church as a field hospital after battle. I see clearly that the thing the church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful."

We are tremendously fortunate with the large number of people who are involved with so many different ministries and parish groups in Whitehall parish. I think we take it for granted to some extent but its only when we visit other parishes or talk to the other Deacons in the diocese and they are genuinely amazed when I tell them about the number of people that are so actively involved in parish life both here and in Donaghmede.

We thank God for this great gift of community on this Feast of the Holy Trinity. This should also cause us to reflect on what other work God may be calling us to do in our parish and in particular how we can reach out to those in need whether that need is spiritual, or material or friendship.

Trinity Sunday

27th May 2018

This weekend we are celebrating Trinity Sunday which is, of course, the feast day of my own parish, Holy Trinity Donaghmede.

I was on retreat a while ago in Mount St Anne's near Killenard, Co Laois in a centre run by the Presentation Sisters. On the wall on my way in I could not help but notice a copy of Rublev's icon of the Holy Trinity. I am always struck by the conversational nature of this picture, how it is that the three persons of the blessed Trinity seem to be so at ease and united in their purpose. It is as if the Holy Trinity acts as a community of faith, sharing and disseminating the love of God.

We understand God in three ways; as Father and creator, as Son and redeemer, and as God's Spirit left to guide and strengthen us. God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit reach out to us with love in abundance.

God chose to reveal himself as one God to the people of Israel in the Old Testament. In the Book of Deuteronomy, we are told that "The

Lord of God is One Lord. (Deut 6:4)" However, in the New Testament, when God the Son becomes man, he openly reveals the persons of God.

Firstly, the relationship between the Father and the Son is revealed: "No one has ever seen God; the Only Son has made him known" (John 1:18).

He then reveals the relationship between the Father and the Holy Spirit: "When the Paraclete comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness." (John 15:26)

The Holy Trinity is also the central theme of the Apostles' Creed which we often say at mass. The first two lines "I believe in God the Father Almighty" refers to God the Father and the third line says "and in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord" and later it says "I believe in the Holy Spirit". So, this familiar prayer is an affirmation of our belief in the Holy Trinity.

Dear Lord, I pray for my child and all students about to sit exams.

Help them to keep calm and clear-minded. Fill them with your peace so that they may be able to make best use of their abilities. Do not let the burden of fear and nervousness prevent them from doing as well as they deserve. However, teach them not to measure their self worth by the mark they receive but rather by the effort they put in. Guide their footsteps when they walk alone, but help them also to be there for each other, supporting and encouraging in the truest spirit of friendship. Lord, bless everyone today who has given of themselves to these students on their journey, teachers, family, friends and fellow classmates. Teach them to be thankful, despite the stress and worry that exams bring, they have this opportunity that many people all over the world are deprived of. May the light of Jesus shine gently on them now and during any difficult times they might face on their journey through life.
