3. We ask forgiveness for some members of the Church's hierarchy who did not take charge of these painful situations and kept quiet. We ask forgiveness.
4. We ask forgiveness for all those times when many single mothers were told that to seek their children who had been separated from them, and the same being said to daughters and sons themselves, that this was a mortal sin. This is not a mortal sin.

We ask forgiveness.

Lord, sustain and increase this state of shame, and give us the strength to work for justice. Amen."

I think these words really speak powerfully for themselves. It's important for us all to reflect on what the Pope had to say. We thank God for his successful visit and the many significant gestures and remarks that he made.

In particular, it was wonderful to see him visit the Capuchin Day Centre and to acknowledge the wonderful work done by Brother Kevin Crowley over so many years for the less well off in our city.

Pope Francis said: *"They help you without taking away your dignity....that's the face of Jesus Christ."*

Brother Kevin was quoted by RTE as follows:

"Wherever Pope Francis went he always made sure the poor were his priority and I think that is one of the greatest gifts for us here today that the Pope came to visit the centre and showed his great love for the poor and for the homeless."

On his way home on the Aer Lingus plane, Pope Francis told the media who travelled with him that he *"found much faith in Ireland...the country is in the process of healing and the Irish people have faith, lots of faith."* Let us thank God for the Pope's presence amongst us last week and for his words of inspiration, challenge and encouragement. We all have different memories of Pope Francis's historic visit to Ireland last week. I would like to briefly reflect on what were for me two memorable moments: the Pope's remarks in the Phoenix Park on abuse and his visit to the Capuchin Day Centre.

If you were present at the Phoenix Park mass on Sunday or watched it on television or on the internet, you will have heard his comments about the abuse crisis which he made during the Penitential Rite of the mass. They were handwritten and have been widely reported in the media.

The Pope's prayer was translated by his interpreter Monsignor Mark Miles and has been published online by the Diocese of Elphin.

Pope Francis spoke as follows:

"Yesterday, I met with eight survivors who have suffered

abuse of power, conscience, and also sexual abuse. Taking up on what they said to me, I want to place before the mercy of the Lord these crimes, and ask forgiveness for them.

1. We ask forgiveness for the abuses in Ireland, abuses of power, conscience, and sexual abuse perpetrated by members with roles of responsibility in the Church. In a special way we ask pardon for all the abuses committed in various types of institutions run by male or female religious and by other members of the Church, and we ask forgiveness for those cases of exploitation through manual work that so many women and men were subjected to. We ask forgiveness.

2. We ask forgiveness for the times that as a Church we did

It is commonplace to say that today you come to a different Ireland. The Church in Ireland has gone through challenging times. People have been wounded in the depth of their being by Church people; people’s faith has been challenged and the Church of Jesus Christ has been wounded.

This Cross which dominates our gathering today is a symbol. It was probably never intended to be a permanent memorial. There were times when people asked that it be removed. There were times when this Cross appeared starkly isolated in the bleakness of an Irish winter.

In these years Ireland has had its winter moments but also its moments of spring. Those of us who know what an Irish winter is like – and we have had good experience of that this year – know also what happens when the first rays of spring sun emerge. Ireland changes. Today we gather around the same cross in the hope of a spring for the Irish Church. We look towards a spring sun that does not wish to cover up the harshness of dark days. We wish rather to help families realise anew that the future of Ireland needs the light of the message of Jesus Christ to reappear in all its simplicity and hopefulness.

It may seem a paradox for me to say in the same breath that the faith in Ireland is strong and that faith in Ireland is fragile. There is an intrinsic fragility in faith can steer us away from arrogance and self-centredness and as our Gospel reading will remind us, to journey with Jesus even when others “stop going with him”.
