

of our daily lives. As Patrick Kavanagh said, "God is in the bits and pieces of life".

Life as a quest is embedded deeply in our humanity and is often expressed in literature. The poet Henry Vaughan once wrote that mankind is "ever restless and irregular, about this earth doth run and ride" and also said that "God ordered motion but ordained no rest".

In our First Reading, Solomon is given an opportunity to make a request to God and he chooses the following: "Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil." God is impressed with his request and replies positively "I give you a heart wise and shrewd as none before you has had and none will have after you."

I think it is fair to say that, in making this particular request, Solomon was already showing great wisdom and discernment on his journey of faith. He already discovered the pearl of great price and wanted further help from God, so that his journey would become more fruitful. The three parables today are unique to the Gospel of Matthew. They give us an insight into what was important to him. And for him, whether it is the "treasure hidden in a field", the "merchant looking for fine pearls" or the "dragnet cast into the sea that brings in a haul of all kinds" each suggests a quest for something very important and which, once discovered, is far too precious to be kept to oneself to must be shared with others.

We too have been given this gift of the Gospel which St Matthew also discovered. Let us pray that in the coming week we may be able to share it with others in the different circumstances of our lives. And, while we may not have the Wisdom of Solomon, we can be sure that if we ask the Holy Spirit for guidance, he will most certainly assist us.
