

boat and rail over a couple of days. Today it is an easier journey but we still have the sense of travelling on pilgrimage, making a journey of faith.

And one of the good things about a pilgrimage is that it gives us an opportunity to step out of our daily lives and try to gain some fresh perspectives on the challenges that we face and to try to learn a bit more about ourselves. It's also a good opportunity to reflect on our faults and failings, as we all have them, and to ask Our Lady to pray to her Son Jesus to help us to overcome them. After the pilgrimage is over, we hope that we may return home as better people with fresh insights into how God is present in our lives and what he is calling us to do.

In the eighth apparition to Bernadette on February 24th 1858, Our Lady asked Bernadette to pray for the conversion of sinners. And then in the ninth apparition Our Lady asked Bernadette to "go and drink at the spring and wash yourself"

at the miraculous spring that appeared when Bernadette dug in the earth. The message here is that an act of penitence can lead to purification and to forgiveness, which is particularly appropriate to recall during Lent. Here we have an image of Our Lady inviting us to wash ourselves and to be cleaned spiritually by our Pilgrimage to Lourdes. The message of Lourdes is an invitation to reconciliation with God.

When speaking about Lourdes, Pope Francis referred to the very special place that sick people have there. He said :

"Like Saint Bernadette, we stand beneath the watchful gaze of Mary. Let us ask Mary Immaculate for the grace always to relate to the sick as persons who certainly need assistance, at times even for the simplest of things, but who have a gift of their own to share with others."

Whether we go on pilgrimage to a near or far destination in the coming year, let us pray for the grace that, like our ancestors before us, we may be inspired by the journey and may find peace and greater meaning in life from our efforts.

"Why go on Pilgrimage?"

The idea of going on pilgrimage goes back hundreds of years in the Church. In the middle ages, crusaders went to Jerusalem to try to liberate the Holy City. Later on, we have the tradition of pilgrimages to places like Santiago de Compostella commencing in Dublin, as many of you know, from St James Gate at Guinness brewery.

The latter pilgrimage has grown in popularity in recent years and is now more popularly referred to as the *Camino*. Many students or people who want to take time out for various reasons or simply enjoy the exercise have walked this ancient pilgrimage route in recent years.

Closer to home we know from our history books about great monastic saints such as Columbanus going on great journeys across dangerous seas and oceans with the aim of spreading the faith.

Some of us may have been fortunate to go on pilgrimage to the Holy Land but for many our pilgrimage destination may be nearer to home such as Lourdes, Fatima and, of

course, our own beloved Marian shrine of Knock.

Pilgrimages provide us all with a bit of space to step out of our ordinary lives for a short time and to make a spiritual journey in the footsteps of those who have travelled the same road many times before us.

We have a great devotion to Lourdes in Whitehall parish and this year we will once again go on pilgrimage to Lourdes from September 7th-12th, details of which are elsewhere in this newsletter. This year we celebrate the 160th anniversary of the apparitions in 1858, so it might be a good time to think about going.

Our Lady did not appear there in South Western France to boost the tourist industry but this has certainly been one of the side effects as thousands of people from all over the world go to Lourdes on pilgrimage every year.

Of course, the first pilgrims from Ireland would have experienced some hardship travelling there by
