

part of one of the responses that we say after the consecration at mass. Then Jesus gives us a new beatitude: *“Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe”* which speaks directly to the faith of succeeding generations, including ourselves.

In these words, Jesus is suggesting a “greater blessedness”, as Father Martin Hogan puts it, for those people who believe in Jesus without having seen him in his risen glory as the apostles did.

The last section of our Gospel today states: *“there were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw but they are not recorded in this book.”* We can only speculate about what these additional appearances of Jesus may have involved but, I think, we can safely assume that one of them must have included an appearance to his mother Mary. Could the fact that Mary was not present with the other women who went to the tomb early on that first Easter Sunday morning indicate that Our Lady had already met with the Risen Lord? Saint John Paul II and Saint Ignatius of Loyola were among those who believed that one of the *“other signs”* referred to certainly included this most precious meeting.

The Season of Easter lasts for fifty days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost and is slightly longer than the Season of Lent which has just concluded. In the coming weeks, let us celebrate and share our Easter joy with those we meet who may be in need of inspiration and encouragement.

I would like to wish you all a very happy and peaceful Season of Easter.

Out of the bleakness of Good Friday, the horror of the cross and the starkness of the tomb, God brings new life. Just when it seemed that darkness had enveloped the world, that evil had triumphed, the glorious light of Easter bursts forth and the darkness vanishes forever.

Easter offers hope to all who are oppressed, broken and hopeless. God’s grace can bring new life into any situation no matter how hopeless it may seem.

Each and every person to whom the risen Lord appears are sent out as messengers of Easter joy and hope. Jesus says to them: *“As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.”*

Easter is encouraging us to make new beginnings, to turn over the page and to break out in new directions. Blessed John Henry Newman said *“to live is to change”*

and this time of the year, the new growth of Springtime (which is slow enough to get going this year as many gardeners and farmers would tell you), encourages us to turn over a new leaf and to start afresh.

We are also called, I think, to share our Easter joy with those in need. Jesus said *“I have come that you may have life and have it to the full.”* Our calling is to inspire others so that they in their turn can put their gifts and talents at the service of those in need in our community.

In our Gospel today, we meet Saint Thomas. He initially doubted the resurrection and would not believe the other apostles when they told him: *“We have seen the Lord!”*

But later we hear him speak one of the most famous phrases in all of scripture: *“My Lord and my God.”* These words have become
