

down and had let each other down. They looked around and like any group felt memories of hurt, shame, let-down, injury and harm. They saw those who had abandoned Jesus and tried to cover up the sin; or they saw others who just knew they had done wrong and were sorry. All were forgiven."

Father Donal concludes his reflection with these words: "We follow Christ with all sorts of personal gifts, talents and sins in our back-pack. Like people on pilgrimage, we are cluttered. The Holy Spirit opens our hearts to let this baggage just fly away! We are people of freedom and of a new song."

He then challenges us by asking: "What song do I sing in the presence of the Lord? One that brings me back into misery like singing of shame and misery or one that brings me into the freedom of the Alleluia? Can my heart dance with the joy and hope of Pentecost?"

In Donaghmede parish we have the Confirmation ceremony for one of our RCIA candidates this Pentecost Sunday. Let us pray for her that the Holy Spirit will inspire and direct her journey of faith in the years to come as she prepares for her wedding in Brazil next year. It is certainly a very appropriate day for a Confirmation ceremony and we also pray that, as a parish community, we may also experience the grace of the Holy Spirit at this time as we try to discern our way forward as church in these most challenging times.

Some of you may have visited Manresa, the Jesuit Retreat Centre in Clontarf. In the prayer room, there are some beautiful stained glass windows by the renowned artist, Evie Hone.

One of them is entitled "Pentecost". The Manresa website explains that:

"The window shows the arrival of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the Apostles. The lower section depicts the ministry of the Apostles after Pentecost as they attended to the care and healing of the sick."

The fact that Our Lady is depicted right in the centre of the apostles with her hands raised in prayer as the Holy Spirit descends on them is really significant. The mother of Jesus remained with the apostles after the Crucifixion, the Resurrection and the Ascension. Now, she is also present at Pentecost. It can be said that, through her prayers and patience, she encouraged the Apostles to prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit. This time has been described as the first Church retreat as the apostles prayed and reflected on their future mission in the Church.

It's also a good time for us to reflect on

our own mission and ministry as we all have one. It may be a ministry of prayer, a ministry of welcome, a ministry of assisting others, a ministry of service to the poor, a ministry of music or a ministry on the altar assisting with the liturgy.

Just as the apostles did not know what the call of Jesus would mean in their lives, so it is for us as Jesus's plans for us may only become gradually clearer over time. As Blessed John Henry Newman wrote:

*"Lead kindly light,
Lead gently on,
I do not ask to see the distant scene
One step is enough"*

Father Donal Neary makes the following comments about Pentecost: "Pentecost is really something new! The first reading is a new call and new mercy. The gospel is about the coming of the Spirit and the main sign of the Spirit is forgiveness."

He goes on to say that: "There was a lot of need for forgiveness around in the first group of Jesus' followers. They had let him
