

172 sick pilgrims from Dublin travelled to Lourdes and were cared for by a small army of volunteers which included 130 sixth year pupils from 23 secondary schools across the Diocese, along with 300 young adults in the 19-23 age group. In addition, there were 10 doctors, 46 nurses and a large number of adult helpers many of whom come every year paying their own way and taking annual leave from work. Their commitment and dedication is quite extraordinary.

In total 1,850 pilgrims travelled to Lourdes last week and were led by His Grace, Archbishop Diarmuid Martin. By any standards this is an extraordinary logistical challenge and full credit to all involved. Speaking at the end of the pilgrimage, Archbishop Martin said: *"We have cared for our sick pilgrims and our sick pilgrims have inspired us. We have been renewed in our faith and in our devotion to Mary, our Mother and Mother of the Church."*

The Archbishop concluded by saying: *"My hope is that we will take away with us the lessons we have learned about our God who looks after the poor and the weak and who challenges us to renounce a logic of power and possession."*

Each of us has to respond to the challenge as to how we can bring the spirit of Lourdes to the care of the sick and less well off in our own community. Our own parish pilgrims lit a candle for all your intentions which were specially remembered at the shrine.

**15th September 2019**

Today's Gospel is the familiar story about the prodigal son who went off and squandered his inheritance but was later forgiven and welcomed back home by this father. I often reflect on the reaction of his brother who did everything right and played by the rules but felt (perhaps unfairly) that he got very little thanks for his diligence and loyalty.

As the Jesuit writer, Father Donal Neary puts it when reflecting on this reading: *"This is a real family story about breakups and reconciliation, about love that covers all sorts of happenings and about love to the end. It is about a father who loved all the time, and many a parent identifies with it."*

Father Kieran O'Mahony makes the following point about this reading: *"Like many a parable, this story makes its point in what seems to be unfair: the spendthrift son is rewarded and the elder son is hurt and angry. Jesus is telling us that love is a free gift, not something we earn by our goodness. This is true of human love, and is also true of God's love."*

The spiritual writer Henri Nouwen,

wrote a wonderful book called "The Return of the Prodigal Son" which I would recommend if you ever come across it. It has sold over a million copies worldwide. In the book, Nouwen reflects on his experience of contemplating Rembrandt's famous painting of the Return of the Prodigal Son. It's a wonderful book where art meets a famous gospel story and inspires a wonderful meditation by the author. We may not immediately think about art as a means of spiritual reflection but a picture can sometime speak a thousand words and, of course, each of us will have our own reflection on what we are observing.

I have just returned from a wonderful and inspiring pilgrimage to Lourdes with a number of our parishioners. What really impresses me about Lourdes is the wonderful care that is taken of the sick and elderly people who visit and stay, not usually in hotels, but in the Accueil Notre Dame which is located on the grounds of the shrine.
