Feast day of
Saint John Henry Newman

9th October 2022

Today marks the Feast day of Saint John Henry Newman. It is not strictly celebrated this year as it falls on a Sunday. He is a relatively recent Saint as he was canonised by Pope Francis on October 13th 2019. Speaking at the canonisation of Saint John Henry Newman in St Peter's Square in Rome, Pope Francis quoted these words from the new Saint: *"The Christian has a deep, silent, hidden peace, which the world sees not... The Christian is cheerful, easy, kind, gentle, courteous, candid, unassuming; has no pretence... with so little that is unusual or striking in his bearing, that he may easily be taken at first sight for an ordinary man"* (Parochial and Plain Sermons, V, 5).

We continue to keep in our prayers the people of Ukraine

he lived in Birmingham. Newman points out that sometimes we are led to think that we ought to be useful on a large scale and to move away from our usual "line of life". But he tells us that this should not be the case. *"We need not give up our usual manner of life, in order to serve God and that "that the most humble and quietest station is acceptable to Him, if improved duly."*

In one of his more famous quotations, Saint John Henry wrote: *"In a higher world it is otherwise but here below to live is to change and to be perfect is to change often"*. I think this perfectly describes his pragmatic approach to life and to ministry. It is a most opportune time for Newman to be canonised as he is a moderate voice of reason who encourages constructive and worthwhile debate on the issues of the day.

Newman was a leading intellectual and writer of 19th century England who famously converted to Catholicism, founded what later became University College Dublin and is known for his prayerful concern for people's spiritual welfare and his love for the poor where

tion, our now retired Archbishop Diarmuid Martin said:

“Newman persisted in his search amid the gloom of evening, when the night was dark and when he was far from home, trusting in that kindly light that would lead him on. In the moments when he was tempted to seek and chose his own path, he slowly began to remember that only the kindly light of God would lead him step by step into the future and so become ever more himself. Newman’s search into faith became a never finished seeking.”

Newman also wrote about the importance of an educated catholic laity and the important role that they play in the life of the church. He also spoke about journeying from out of shadows and images into the truth. For him, life was an evolving journey lead by the kindly light of Christ. Newman’s legacy is one of tolerance and dialogue, so necessary in the church of today which has to deal with so many challenges as we rebuild following the pandemic. A parish priest recently told me that only 75%-80% of his pre COVID congregation have returned, and some parish groups have not resumed.

Saint John Henry is shining example for us all of courage and commitment to the faith at a time when it is much needed in our world today. It is in many ways providential that this great figure of the 19th century, whose thinking foresaw Vatican II, should be canonised at this time. Let us all pray to the new Saint John Henry for all our needs and intentions and those of our families, friends and parish communities.

In our Gospel reading today, we have the story of the ten lepers. I think that this story is really about gratitude. Only one of the ten came back to say thanks. Often in our world today we can be too busy to thank people who have helped us in different ways, but the Gospel today challenges us to make the effort. It is worth noting that the ten lepers were not healed immediately but instead Jesus asks them to do something which is to go to the priests to verify their cures under the Jewish law. Our own prayers are not always answered there and then either but over time we can discern – a bit like John Henry Newman – that God gradually reveals his plans for us as well.
